PAINTING TIP

Use clear contact paper to cover patterns of what you want to save. Either before or after painted and dried. Scotch Magic tape will not leak, if used in watercolor to hold lines. Green Frog tape, although more expensive, does not leak. There is a UV varnish called Frog

Juice, it comes in oil or acrylic, and the sun will not fade your paintings. Go on line and ask for—Frog Juice.

COOKING

Best Pancakes

1 Cup Flour, 1 cup milk, 3 Teaspoons baking powder

2 Tablespoons oil, and sugar

2 eggs [separate the eggs, beat the whites, stiff]--add the yolks to the above ingredients-Mix all ingredients, with a beater {I do the egg whites first, then I do not have to clean the beater} Fold in the egg whites,

Cook on a hot griddle—um--um--good with real butter and real maple syrup! You can $\frac{1}{2}$ the receipt as it makes about 8, sometimes I add blueberries or nuts
